

Fundraising Activities

The Maury PTA Fundraising Committee works hard every year to support teachers, aides, and programing for our students and we hope you will join us in helping to raise the resources needed to sustain our vibrant school. This year, the PTA hopes to raise over \$165,000—that's a lot of money and we can't do it without you! Learn more below about what we do, and ways you can get involved.

Maury PTA Dues. Annual membership dues are \$15 per member, and are vital to supporting our PTA.

Maury at the Market | Saturday, April 21, 2018. This is far and away the biggest Maury social and fundraising event of the year, with a goal this year to raise \$90,000 for the PTA. This fun, adults-only evening features a live auction and silent auction and is a great way to connect with the adults in the Maury community! There are ways large and small to support the effort: seeking sponsors, collecting items to be auctioned, donating items, hanging posters, or working a shift during the event. There are sponsorship opportunities for companies, corporations—even families. Many volunteers are already committed, but we still need a chair! Support the Annual Fund. The Annual Fund provides funding for classroom supports, school supplies, and programs such as Mindfulness, Readers and Writers Workshop, and the Literacy Lab. This year, our goal is to raise \$30,000 this year for this initiative—please see the Annual Fund page in this packet.

Maury Yard Sale | Saturday, September 16, 2017. This annual event is a great way to clean out your closets, find some good bargains, and donate to the PTA. Donations of clean, lightly-used clothing (including uniforms), household items, furniture, books, and toys for every age and interest are welcome. And new this year: a chic boutique of high-end designer clothes. This year we hope to raise \$10,500!

Dining Out for Maury. The first Tuesday of the month is Maury Night at Tunnicliff's! Tunnicliff's contributes 15% of all sales from 5–9 PM back to Maury. This is a fun way to get together with your children's friends and their families, and support the PTA—and more importantly, not have to cook! We hope to raise \$2,000.

Weekly Bake Sale. Maury hosts a bake sale in the lobby every Wednesday after school. All items are \$1, and all proceeds go to the PTA. You can support this effort by signing up to be a baker, seller, or by sending your student with money to buy an item—or all of the above. The commitment is low, but the rewards are great—we'll raise close to \$8,500 through this effort.

T-Shirts and Other Swag. In the Fall and Spring there are t-shirt sales, along with other Cougar merchandise. We hope to raise \$1,000 with this effort.

Support Through Shopping. There are several ways to support Maury PTA through the everyday shopping you will do for your family. These efforts combined will raise about \$3,200. Links and more information is available on the school website at: **mauryelementary.com/fundraising**.

- Mabel's Labels. Your student will need to have their items labeled for school (and don't forget about summer camps and sports teams so order a lot!) and ordering through Mabel's Labels will give a percentage back to Maury PTA.
- French Toast. When ordering your students uniforms check French Toast for some great and durable styles and a percentage of sales comes back to the PTA.
- Splendid Portraits. We even get a percentage of what you spend on picture day!
- Tea Collection Clothing. Love the brand Tea Collection for your kids? Twice a year we receive a special online shopping code (feel free to share with friends and family!) that gives Maury PTA a percentage back on sales.

Theme Dress Pass Day. This fundraiser started just a few years ago as Pajama Pass Day, but has grown in popularity to four times a year—and not just pajamas! For \$2, students can buy a pass to wear clothes of a theme on a specific day—pajamas, superhero, regular clothes. It's lots of fun, and a great way for everyone to help the school. We expect to raise over \$2,000.

Box Tops and Labels for Education. Remember to save those Box Tops and Labels found on all kinds of grocery products (mainly items like soup, cereal, pasta, prepared and canned items). They are worth 10 cents each and we hope to raise \$500—that's 5,000 tops—so start saving! Box tops and labels are collected all year long, and can be dropped off near the PTA mailbox, behind the security desk.

There are also a few other smaller events throughout the year, but this is a snapshot of what you can expect. I hope you can see how crucial these events are to the overall fundraising effort. Please consider joining the PTA and supporting these events—not only with financial resources, but your time and talent. The PTA would not be able to fund the fantastic programing provided to our children without the combined efforts of our Maury Family—we are glad you are part of that family!

Promoting Social and Emotional Learning

Social and emotional learning (SEL) is the process through which children and adults acquire and apply the skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, show empathy for others, maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions. SEL is vital for student success in school, work, and life!

Maury emphasizes SEL in several different ways:

Ashoka Changemaker School. Since 2013, Maury has been designated by the Ashoka Foundation as a Changemaker School. Through this initiative, we seek to cultivate empathy, teamwork, leadership, and problem solving so both parents and students can become changemakers. One way we do this is by "buddy classes" that pair upper grade and lower grade classes to do academic and social activities together.

Responsive Classroom. This approach to teaching consists of classroom and schoolwide practices for deliberately helping children build academic and social-emotional competencies within a strong and safe school community. Everyone at Maury is expected to treat one another with kindness and respect. Each month, the whole school joins together for a Morning Meeting where different classes take turn leading and students are recognized for being empathy leaders.



The Social and Emotional Learning Committee promotes SEL through activities like **Operation: GRAND**, an event to honor our children's relationships with their elders.

Home Visits. In partnership with the Flamboyan Foundation, Maury has implemented home visits near the start of the school year for all grades. These visits allow teachers to meet and learn more about their students, which sets the foundation for a collaborative and trusting relationship to support each student's learning.

Mindfulness. In partnership with Minds, Inc., the Grade 2 and Grade 3 classes are led in twice-a-week mindfulness sessions over six weeks by a Minds, Inc. teacher. Mindfulness trains participants to pay attention to the present moment through simple breathing and other exercises. It helps students build in a "pause button" to react thoughtfully instead of impulsively.

Roots of Empathy. The Roots of Empathy Program pairs Grade 4 classes with a baby and his/her parent over a nine-week period. Students become attuned to the baby's needs and emotions. This opens a gateway for the students to learn bigger lessons about taking care of one another and considering others' feelings.

Second Step. Second Step provides age-appropriate music and videos, take-home activities, and stories to help teachers integrate SEL into their lessons. Skills focus on sparking curiosity, problem-solving, self-regulation, and empathy.

What is a listserv?

It's a message board, a problem-solver, a place to ask questions and get answers. Post photos from a class trip, or see photos from the trip you missed. Don't know if the kids need to wear their uniforms on the field trip? Post the question, get the answer. Or, a teacher requests egg cartons—you happen to have them.

Is this going to flood my inbox with unwanted e-mail?

No, the frequency of the e-mails is under your control. Go to Edit Membership, and under Option #2, you have the choice of individual e-mails (most timely), a daily digest, or no e-mail (you'll have to check the group site to get any information).

• Can anyone join?

No, the listserv is limited to parents, guardians, teachers, staff, and community members with a current and direct link to the school. The wider community stays connected with the school through the website, Facebook, and other means.

• Listserv etiquette is important—remember that what you post will be seen widely throughout our community. Before you hit send, check whether your message is going to the individual or to the whole listserv.
